Noted Architect Tian Feng Honored by National Council of Architectural Registration Boards

SACRAMENTO—Tian Feng, a noted Chinese American architect and president of the [California Architects Board](http://www.cab.ca.gov), was recently honored with the [President's Medal of Distinguished Service](#) by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB).

His leadership has exemplified California's core value for diversity and has made significant impact to the architectural profession at the national level.
